FROM THE MANSE...

Dear Friends

One of the graces that Paul expresses gratitude for when he writes to the church in Philippi is their generosity, and that is something that I often have cause to give thanks for in our own



context here in Kinross. During lockdown when many congregations struggled to make ends meet financially, we were blessed by continued generous giving and our treasurer has remarked on that repeatedly over the last couple of years. When an opportunity was given last October to take part in the National Giving Day set apart by the General Assembly to help congregations it was decided that we in Kinross should take a thankoffering from which all proceeds would be used to support community groups many of whom were struggling financially as a result of the pandemic. Some £5,500 was gifted and it has been agreed to disburse this to support **Broke Not Broken** to support those struggling with energy bills, Kinross Centre to support the elderly, An Cala to support those with complex disabilities, Kinross Otters to support their adversity fund, Traidcraft gift bags for individuals in need of encouragement, and a contribution towards a project to develop our church garden as a community space to benefit young and old alike. Please pray that this will be a blessing to many in our community.

At our recent Kirk Session meeting we received news from our partner church in Debrecen about support they are giving to **help renovate a property owned by a Hungarian Reformed congregation in Ukraine to give shelter to refugees.** It was decided to make an immediate donation of £4,000 towards the renovations from our church funds and to invite any in our congregation who wish to contribute additional funds for ongoing support in the months ahead (p10). It is our privilege to be able to support those in need at this time and we pray that this too will be a blessing.

Of course there are other ways to be generous than by giving money and it is my prayer at this challenging time in our own church life locally and nationally that many will also be moved to generosity of their time and of their gifts and skills. There are various tasks needing to be done and currently few volunteers coming forward to take them up. Paul writes of the Philippians that "they gave themselves first of all to the Lord and then by the will of God also to us." (2 Cor.8:5) May the same be said of us.

Eco-Congregation Event Congregational Cycle Ride Saturday 27 August


Dust off your bike for a social get-together.

New Mission Plan

Kirk Session met with representatives of Perth Presbytery on 7 April to discuss and ask questions about the new Presbytery Mission Plan. This interim report sets out proposals for the vision that the Presbytery's Planning and Development Committee has for all the churches in the Presbytery.

Kinross Parish Church would be part of 'Network One, Loch Leven Churches' with Orwell and Portmoak, Cleish and Fossoway, and Arngask (Glenfarg). This network would be allocated two ministers – a reduction from three ministers currently – and the church buildings at Cleish, Portmoak and Glenfarg would close.

Session Clerk, Jaffrey Weir says: "There is a lot to be discussed internally, and with other churches, and existing ministers in planning for the future. This change will be gradual and will involve all of us on how we, as an area, make the changes necessary so that we can be sustainable and build Christ's Kingdom in Kinross-shire through Mission and Outreach now and in the future. We all need to be aware and keep in our thoughts and prayers the ministers, all the congregations and the Kirk Sessions as hard decisions will need to be made over the coming years."

Conference Report: Recharging the Eldership

Over 150 elders, including Kathleen Weir, Robert Mitchell and Gordon McFarlane from our church, attended a recent, over-subscribed, conference in Glasgow on Recharging the Eldership.

The conference was organised by Robert Hynd, Moderator of the Presbytery of Glasgow and himself an elder. Guest speakers included the Moderator of the General Assembly, Lord Wallace of Tankerness, and Dave Kendall, Chief Officer of the Church, both of whom are elders, as well as ministers and elders from all parts of Scotland.

Robert Hynd said: "With our Church facing a future in which there will be fewer ministers, it is surely more important than ever that we recognise the contributions which elders can make. It felt like the perfect moment to look at how we can develop and recharge the eldership so that it can best serve the Church."

Based in Kinross, the Stephen Lyon Organisation empowers those experiencing suicidal thoughts or struggling with aspects of their life to take back control.

It was set up after the death of Stephen Lyon from suicide in June 2020. He was only 21 years old and had shown no significant signs that he was




struggling or having suicidal thoughts. Stephen's death was very sudden and the emotional pain of losing Stephen stimulated his family to set up a foundation in his memory.

The organisation delivers workshops to young people 14 years plus to raise awareness and help them understand the factors that influence suicidal thoughts and where they should go to for help. It takes referrals for those 16 years plus from a range of sources including self-referral. The organisation is led by a board of trustees and has a passionate team of volunteers and staff.

How can we support Ukrainian refugees?

We are partnered with the Great Church, Debrecen, Hungary, which is supporting refugees from adjacent Ukraine. We have been in touch with them to explore how best to support their work.

They have been supporting a congregation in Ukraine itself, at **Csongor**, close to the Hungarian border. The Csongor church has been looking after displaced families and now has a longer-term project, which the Great Church is supporting, to renovate a building as a 'shelter-house' (estimate US\$15,000), providing



accommodation for doctors and temporary accommodation for refugees. The Great Church has recommended this project to us as a way of giving long-term support. This appeal is commended to you by the Kirk Session. A Refugee Church

As this is being written, the plight of the many millions of refugees fleeing the war in Ukraine is very much at the front of our minds – and rightly so. Also, only a few months ago, we were concerned about the many refugees fleeing Afghanistan as a result of the Taliban take over. It is not well recognised that the global church is a *refugee* church.

According to the UN High Commissioner for Refugees, by mid-2021 the number of forcibly displaced people worldwide had surpassed 84 million. Many of these are Christians. The majority are displaced through violence, like the Christians among the millions fleeing for their lives in Afghanistan. In countries such as Burkina Faso, Mali, Niger and Nigeria, churches and communities have been attacked. Sadly, also, Christians from places like Iran leave because they have simply had enough of the daily struggle against severe discrimination.

However, life on the move or in refugee camps can be even more fragile and exposes Christians to discrimination, extortion, human trafficking and rape. Thankfully, there are Christian charities, such as Help the Persecuted (<u>https://htp.org</u>), Samaritan's Purse (<u>https://www.samaritans-purse.co.uk</u>) and SIM (<u>https://sim.co.uk</u>), among several organisations seeking to help such refugees. Their websites give information about their work and how you can support it.



Feed the hungry!

Christian Aid Week 15-21 May 2022

The focus of Christian Aid Week 2022 was on providing food for the hungry in Zimbabwe where seven out of ten women rely on farming to earn a living and provide food for their families. Climate change has led to

drought and with no rain women can't grow enough food.
