FROM THE MANSE...

Dear Friends

The last couple of months have seen us exploring the theme of Discipleship in our Sunday morning services and house-groups as we have read and studied the First Letter of John. The next couple of months will take us on the Lenten journey towards Easter during which we will be exploring the life of prayer, an important aspect of our discipleship, guided by the rich heritage of the Psalms. Alison Morgan writes that “the plural of disciple is church” and the more we each seek to grow as disciples of Jesus the more we recognise the need for others' support along the way.

The background to our congregational life is still dominated by the restrictions and challenges brought about by the Covid pandemic which has turned the whole world upside down over the last two years, but we are now entering a new phase in which we hesitantly learn to live with the virus and find ways to return to something more akin to the experience we knew before Covid.

I recognise that many remain hesitant to return to church in person but I do want to encourage those of all ages who have not yet ventured back to a service in the church to give serious and prayerful consideration to doing so in the coming weeks. The church family has missed your presence and your contribution and we have been the poorer for your absence, and while I am glad that we have been able to offer a connection to church via live-streaming and CDs of services I think that you will have been the poorer for not having had the experience of interacting with fellow members of the Body of Christ that we all need if we are to grow up into Christ our Head.

I would also encourage any of you who may feel disconnected from the rest of the congregation to suggest what we might do as a church at this time to help you to re-engage meaningfully. Elders and others will *not* at this stage routinely seek to come in to your home when delivering these magazines but you are encouraged to have a chat with them on the doorstep and to arrange another time when you might speak on the phone or, if appropriate, to meet up in person. We would also like to know what we might do better to minister to children and young families at this time as we try to rebuild our congregational life.

The church is a team of disciples all seeking to play their part in furthering God's Kingdom in the world. There's a place for you in that team in Kinross Parish Church right now. Jesus said, “Come with me.”

Plant a tree for the Jubilee

Kinross Parish Church is celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee by being part of The Queen's Green Canopy supported by Kinross Estate Company and the Woodland Trust.

The Queen's Green Canopy is a tree-planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. Everyone across the UK is being invited to plant trees from October 2021, when the tree planting season begins, through to the end of the Jubilee year in 2022.

We have 210 trees on order for delivery in March 2022. The planning for the planting at the Market Park and in the Kinross Estate is in progress. The Woodland Trust has supported this initiative by providing tree saplings.

Financial Update - 2021

As I write, the accounts for the year ended 31 December are just about complete save for final details and the independent inspection. I can thus comment on the big picture but spare you lots of detail - *sighs of relief all round?!*

Despite ongoing restrictions, I am delighted to report that our income has not only been sustained but has increased this year, resulting in a healthy surplus. On behalf of the Kirk Session I **thank each and every one of you** who has been part of this result. The National Giving Day yielded £5,560, a shining example of your commitment to Kinross Parish Church, and one from which spending for the benefit of the Kinross community will emerge over time. Expenditure was largely in line with expectation and with the 2020 level, so our funds are healthy.

How blessed are we to be in this position, and as we see further easing of Covid restrictions, we must surely feel confident about what lies ahead in 2022.

Once the report and accounts have been signed off, copies will be available from the office or from me, so please ask if you want one. There will also be a summary presentation at the Stated Annual Meeting on **Sunday 20 March**.

PARTNERING WITH MISSION AVIATION FELLOWSHIP

On Sunday 16 January the Jack family joined us to launch our year of partnership with MAF. Former head of MAF Scotland, Ruth Jack, her husband Duncan and their son Samuel were just home after serving MAF for three years in Arnhem Land in Australia's Northern Territories. Ruth and Duncan had been the first married couple to run a MAF overseas country programme. In April, Ruth will become MAF country director in Uganda which programme KPC has chosen to support.



Uganda is a refuge of hope for those fleeing conflict. Today MAF is serving the huge refugee camps that have sprung up to host the influx of people coming from neighbouring South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).

The condition of Uganda's roads makes overland travel dangerous. MAF flights enable humanitarian and mission partners to arrive safely at locations where they are assisting victims of violence, providing nutrition, education and healthcare to children, and delivering training in farming techniques and livelihood support that is lifting households out of poverty for good. Five dedicated aircraft enable any location inside the country to be reached swiftly and safely within 90 minutes. Shuttle flights provide vital connections with areas of need in the DRC and South Sudan. People in need are helped because they can be reached quickly and safely by a MAF plane.

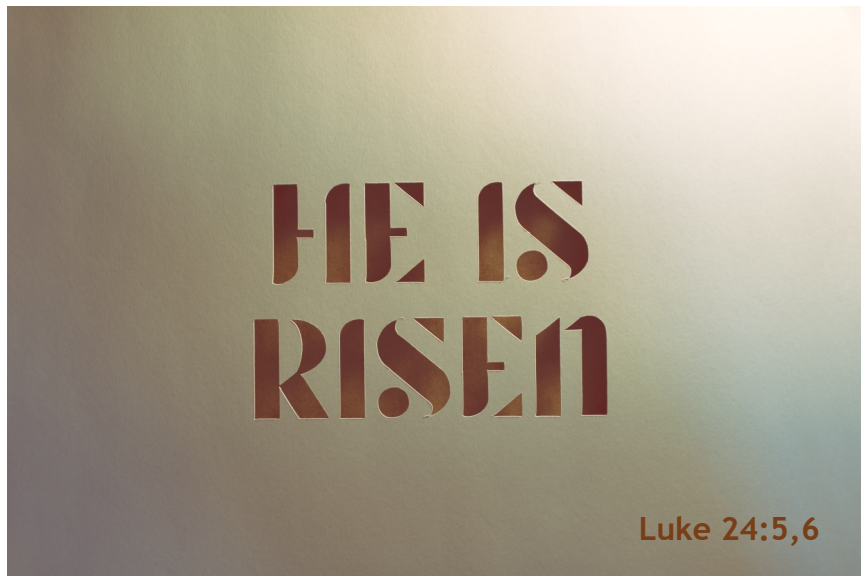
